4. OPEN DISCUSSION –

Councilwoman Giegerich along with other council members welcomed Borough Administrator, Jim Gant. She wished him the best of luck and looks forward to working with him.

Councilwoman Anthony commented Sea Girt Conservancy was awarded a grant for \$20,000.00 from the Monmouth County Municipal Open Space Program. The grant will go towards natural fencing along the rail line, evasive plant removal and new native plantings. She thanked those involved for their assistance obtaining the grant.

5. OLD BUSINESS

A. Ordinances -

1. Ordinance No. 01-2021: The Mayor to read the said Ordinance by Title, advising of its publication in its entirety in Asbury Park Press on January 14, 2021:

ORDINANCE NO. 01-2021 CALENDAR YEAR 2021 ORDINANCE TO EXCEED THE MUNICIPAL BUDGET APPROPRIATION LIMITS AND TO ESTABLISH A CAP BANK (N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.14) IN THE BOROUGH OF SEA GIRT, MONMOUTH COUNTY, NEW JERSEY

WHEREAS, the Local Government Cap Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.1 et seq., provides that in the preparation of its annual budget, a municipality shall limit any increase in said budget up to 2.5% unless authorized by ordinance to increase it to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, subject to certain exceptions; and,

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:4:45-15a provides that a municipality may, when authorized by ordinance, appropriation the difference between the amount of its actual final appropriation and the 3.5% percentage rate as an exception to its final appropriations in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

WHEREAS, the Borough Council of the Borough of Sea Girt in the County of Monmouth finds it advisable and necessary to increase its CY2021 budget by up to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations in the interest of promoting the health, safety and welfare of the citizens; and,

WHEREAS, the Borough Council hereby determines that a 3.5% increase in the budget for said year, amounting to \$181,207.78. in excess of the increase in final appropriations otherwise permitted by the local Government Cap Law is advisable and necessary; and,

WHEREAS, the Borough Council hereby determines that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Sea Girt, in the County of Monmouth, a majority of the full authorized membership of this governing body affirmatively concurring, that in the CY2021 budget year, the final appropriations of the Borough of Sea Girt shall, in accordance with this Ordinance and *N.J.S.A.* 40A:4-45.14, be increased by 3.5%, amounting to \$253,690.89 and that the CY2021 municipal budget for Borough of Sea Girt be approved and adopted in accordance with this Ordinance.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final year budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that a certified copy of this Ordinance as introduced be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services within five (5) days of introduction.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that a certified copy of the Ordinance upon adoption, with the recorded vote included thereon, be filed with said Director within five (5) days after such adopted.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Sea Girt hereby authorizes F.K. Farrell, Mayor to enter into a contract with the professional as described herein.

Section 2. The improvements requested as stated above are equipment purchases that the Borough may lawfully undertake and the amount appropriated therefor is \$105,000.

Section 3. No debt is to be issued for said improvements and the cost of said improvements is to be financed from the funds are presently on hand or accumulated in the Capital Improvement Fund of the Borough of Water-Sewer Utility.

Section 4. Repeal, Severability.

- a. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are repealed, but only to the extent of such inconsistency.
- b. If any section, paragraph, subparagraph, clause or provision of this ordinance shall be adjudged invalid, such adjudication shall apply only to the section, paragraph, subparagraph, clause or provision so adjudged and the remainder of this ordinance shall be deemed valid and effective.

Section 5. Effective Date

This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its final passage and publication as required by law.

- First Avenue/The Parker House Attorney Ray Bogan commented he had a meeting with the County to review First Avenue being an acceptable place for pick up/drop off for large taxi vans; action has been taken; expects a plan soon from The Parker House determining the physical parameters which they are willing to modify in order to accommodate the pick up/drop off area which will then be submitted to the County.
- DPW thanked Mike McArthur and Mrs. Carafa for their efforts coordinating the Sanitation and Recycling Calendar; the calendar has been well received;
- DPW requests residents breakdown cardboard to help economize containers;
- Backup of sewerage please be mindful of placing Swiffer Wipes, paper towels and cleaning rags down drains.

Councilman Mastrorilli reported as follows:

- Fire Company thanked the volunteers for their service; A committee has been researching the purchase of a new fire truck; the cost is approximately \$600K; The Fire Company plans to contribute 25%; he hopes to have this purchase approved at the February 10th council meeting;
- Beach thanked entire beach staff for their great efforts running the beach; season badges will go on sale March 1st through Community Pass; limiting to 7500; sale of daily badges are still being discussed; gate guards are being extended to 5:00 pm; coolers on the beach is also an ongoing discussion.

Councilman Begley reported as follows:

• Finance – thanked Mrs. Carafa for all her efforts on the financials; the Finance Committee is looking forward to working with Administrator, Mr. Gant and CFO, Amy

Spera; the 2021 Budget process begins and we will be looking for input from various groups; he commented the goal is to keep taxes flat under Mayor Farrell's tenure.

Councilwoman Anthony reported as follow:

- Recent windstorms caused misplacement of the sand causing concern with the dunes and beach; she reached out to Borough Engineer, DPW and Beach Staff to discuss beach maintenance along the eastside of the boardwalk and westside of the dunes; in addition public safety will be utilized to ensure an emergency route for vehicles;
- Borough Engineer reviewed The Terrace property along the wetlands next to Wreck Pond; we received a report from the DEP on guidelines regarding non-native evasive growth; subcommittee meeting will be held on Saturday to discuss these guidelines;
- Discussions continue with Cornerstone Architects regarding the Municipal Building, Police and Fire Departments;
- Health Department a new vaccine site opened at Brookdale Community College, additional information can be found on our website: www.seagirt-nj.gov;
- Applications are still available for Memorial Monument Nominations; due by February 28th at the Borough Hall and on our website.

Councilwoman Giegerich reported as follows:

- Plans are in place to discuss with the DEP the tight constraints allowing dogs on the beach;
- Librarian, Lisa Luke has been busy transitioning from the Monmouth County Library to our independent system.

Council President Fetzer reported as follows:

- Water/Sewer meeting is soon and will report at the February 10th meeting;
- There was a PBA Arbitration meeting; decision should be available end of February.

Mayor Farrell reported as follows:

• SMRSA – commented Sea Girt has a done a great job maintaining pipes; he salutes former councils for their efforts.

11. PUBLIC PARTICIPATION ON ANY SUBJECT (Comments limited to 7 minutes)

Jeffrey King, Elizabeth Parkway, Eatontown, asks council to reconsider the exclusion of medical dispensaries and keep an open mind on medical cannabis.

Alan Zakin, Baltimore Boulevard, he congratulated Mr. Gant and Chief Macko; thanked council for the grant which will go towards the safety, beauty and conservation of Edgemere Park; he thanked Councilwoman Anthony who is a catalyst for many great things accomplished. He further thanked Director Arnone and Board of Commissioners and Paul Gleitz from Monmouth County Open Space. The Sea Girt Conservancy looks forward to continuing to better our parks and keeping Sea Girt beautiful.

Edward Grimes, East Hanover, appreciates being seen directly via zoom. He asked if deaf people can participate in zoom meetings; he is an advocate for disabled and cannabis patients; he commented his dismay on medical ban; he asked council to rescind the ban on medical marijuana to help the sick and dying.

Kathleen Merse, Seaside Place, commented her concerns with the drop off at Seaside Beach; the area is safety concern for those walking in the area.

Pat Rogers, Baltimore Boulevard, addressed 2021 beach protocols; she suggests that the Beach Committee ensures beach, boardwalk and community an environment that is safe for residents and visitors; adapt and enhance policy and procedures that support a clean and environmentally safe beach; use the most efficient and effective methods to enforce these policy's; ensure residents and visitors pay their fair share to cover the above costs. She further recommended steps to be taken to improve methods of purchasing daily badges; she would like to see Ordinance enforced to reduce garbage left on the beach and large coolers; extend badge check hours.

Jaime Van Sciver commented she would like the Borough to re-visit the ban on medical cannabis; encourages people to understand how it is being used for medicine purposes.

Suzanne Tufariello, Seaside Place, asked council for clarification on the Code Official report for parking on one side of the street. Mayor Farrell responded the DEP wants more parking and expects by the spring season to be addressed. Councilman Mastrorilli commented that The Public Safety Committee is gathering information. She further commented 7500 season badges seem higher than in past seasons.

Charles Gormally, New York Boulevard, is asking for transparency relative to financial reporting of beach; beach atmosphere is phenomenal; he further commented on Police presence and the expense incurred; he added he didn't see much problematic litter that would cause a concern that would change how rules are enforced at the beach; he asks the community to keep an open mind on medical cannabis.

Ann Britt, Trenton Boulevard, commented she often noticed litter on the beach and the beach not being cared for after hours; she appreciates being fiscally responsible, but there needs to be a balance against public safety and how our resources are being treated; be mindful of revenue.

Minutes – Regular Meeting – Virtual January 27, 2021

Councilman Begley appreciates everyone's comments; the beach is a public utility and the town doesn't derive any benefit from revenues generated by the beach; there is an allocation of resources for employee salaries that are allocated as an expense towards the beach utility; property taxes do not go to beach.

Mayor Farrell commented he picks up garbage while walking; encourages people to please pick up after themselves.

Councilman Mastrorilli thanked the beach staff for their efforts during a difficult season.

There being no further comments, the comment period was closed. There being no further business, and **UPON MOTION** of Councilwoman Anthony, seconded by Council President Fetzer, carried, that the meeting be finally and immediately adjourned at 8:35 PM.
