2. CONSENT AGENDA - Mayor Fetzer requested tabling the Shared Services Agreement with the Township of Wall, Municipal Court Facilities until the February 9th meeting to update Section 10 – Insurance Provision. The Mayor also requested to move the resolutions of Appointment of Full Time SLEO and Urging the USPS to Upgrade Security of Public Collection Mailboxes to New Business.

UPON MOTION of Councilman Clemmensen, seconded by Councilman Zakin, carried, that the following Resolutions be and the same are hereby adopted:

a. R-19-2022: Change Order/Final Payment to Fernandes Construction, Inc. for The Project Known as The Plaza Streetscape Improvements

WHEREAS, the Borough of Sea Girt awarded a contract in the amount of \$297,994.92 to Fernandes Construction, Inc. Monroe, NJ for the Project known as The Plaza Streetscape Improvements on December 9, 2020; and,

WHEREAS, a previous Change Order & Supplemental Agreement No. 1 increased the contract in the amount of \$8,198.23; and,

WHEREAS, Change Order and Supplemental Agreement No. 2 decreased the contract by \$6,992.51 to the project resulting in the new contract total of \$299,200.64; and,

WHEREAS, the Project is completed and the Contractor has submitted the Request for Final Payment in the amount of \$38,580.87 and the required Maintenance Bond of \$74,800.16 that has been reviewed by the Project Engineer and found to be correct.

NOW, THERFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of the Borough of Sea Girt as follows:

- 1. That Change Order and Supplemental Agreement representing a net decrease to the contract of \$1,205.72 to a new contract total of \$299,200.64 be and the same is hereby approved;

 - c. R-21-2022: Authorize Shared Services Agreement with Township of Wall for Leaf Recycling and Disposal Services

WHEREAS, The Uniform Shared Services and Consolidation Act, N.J.S.A. 40A:65-1et seq., authorizes local units as defined in said Act to enter into joint agreements for the provision of government services; and

WHEREAS, The Borough of Sea Girt lacks the facilities and capacity to recycle and/or dispose of leaves collected on an annual basis from its residents; and

WHEREAS, Wall Township has the facilities and ability to provide said services to provide leaf recycling and/or disposal services to The Borough of Sea Girt; and

WHEREAS, The Borough of Sea Girt and Wall Township desire to enter into an Agreement with one another whereby Wall Township shall furnish to the Sea Girt leaf recycling and disposal services as hereinafter set forth in consideration of payment as hereinafter provided al according *N.J.S.A.*40A:65-1 and other applicable statues and regulations.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Borough Council of the Borough of Sea Girt, County of Monmouth, New Jersey that the Borough of Sea Girt are authorized to enter into a contact as described above with the aforementioned Township; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Borough Council including, but not limited to the Mayor, Business Administrator and the Municipal Clerk, are hereby authorized and directed to take such ministerial actions as are necessary to effectuate the provisions of this resolution.

d. R-22-2022: Authorize Shared Purchasing Agreement with the Boroughs of Avon by the Sea, Belmar, Brielle, Lake Como, Manasquan, Sea Girt, and Spring Lake Heights for the Department of Public Works

WHEREAS, The Uniform Shared Services and Consolidation Act, N.J.S.A. 40A:65-1et seq., authorizes local units as defined in said Act to enter into joint agreements for the provision of government services; and

WHEREAS, The Borough Council of the Borough of Sea girt desires to enter into a shared services agreement for the Department of Public Works with Boroughs of Avon by the Sea, Belmar, Brielle, Lake Como, Manasquan, Sea Girt, and Spring Lake Heights (the "Boroughs"); and

WHEREAS, the shared services agreement for the Department of Public Works will include, but not be limited to labor, equipment, material and purchasing of material, equipment, and services for the Boroughs; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Borough Council of the Borough of Sea Girt, County of Monmouth, New Jersey that the Borough of Sea Girt are authorized to enter into a contact as described above with the aforementioned Township; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Borough Council including, but not limited to the Mayor, Business Administrator and the Municipal Clerk, are hereby authorized and directed to take such ministerial actions as are necessary to effectuate the provisions of this resolution.

e. R-23-2022: Authorize Shared Service Agreement with The Borough of Spring Lake for the Provision of Code Enforcement and Assistant Zoning Services

WHEREAS, both The Borough of Spring Lake (hereafter "Recipient") and the Borough of Sea Girt (hereafter "Provider") have been formed in compliance with the applicable statutes and both parties wish to enter into an agreement for shared services pursuant N.J.S.A.65-1 et seq., and

WHEREAS, Provider and Recipient entered into a Shared Service Agreement for the provision of Code Enforcement and Assistant Zoning/Code Enforcement to the Recipient for the period January 1, 2022 through December 31, 2022 with the option to renew for a period of two (2) years, commencing January 1, 2023 through and inclusive of December 31, 2024 upon completion of the one year trial; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Borough Council of the Borough of Sea Girt, County of Monmouth, New Jersey that the Borough of Sea Girt is authorized to enter into a Shared Service Agreement with the aforementioned Borough for the provision of Code Enforcement and Assistant Zoning Services to the Recipient for period for the period January 1, 2022 through December 31, 2022 with the option to renew for a period of two (2) years, commencing January 1, 2023 through and inclusive of December 31, 2024.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Borough Council including, but not limited to the Mayor, Business Administrator and the Municipal Clerk, are hereby authorized and directed to take such ministerial actions as are necessary to effectuate the provisions of this resolution.

f. R-24-2022: Conditionally Approve Use of Borough Property By New Logic Educators, LLC for a Marine Science Camp

WHEREAS, Sea Girt Recreation and the individual named below have requested permission to operate a Marine Science Camp at the Borough Beach and along Wreck Pond in the Borough of Sea Girt July 25 through July 29 and again from August 8 through August 12, 2022 inclusive, between the hours of 9:00 AM and Noon and 12:30 PM – 3:30 PM), inclusive, with the following details supplied by:

- 1. Camp will be for children ages 6 12
- 2. Maximum of 25 children
- 3. Ratio of 1 Staff per 4-6 children
- 4. 3 days on beach, 2 at Wreck Pond
- 5. Children go into the water ankle/knee deep to collect specimens

- 6. Certificate of Insurance naming Borough of Sea Girt as Additional Insured will be provided with current policy dates must be provided
- 7. Will set up Pop-Up tents as needed for shade
- 8. In the event of inclement weather may utilize porch area under pavilion or canopy area with picnic tables
- 9. Will strictly avoid any endangered species restricted areas.

WHEREAS, after discussion, the Borough Council is in favor of permitting this enrichment program to be operated at the Borough beach with certain conditions to ensure that the Borough of Sea Girt will be in compliance with all rules and regulations of the Borough and the Department of Environmental Protection during the operation of this camp.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Sea Girt that permission is hereby granted to New Logic Educators, LLC to operate a Marine Science Camp Program on Borough property with the following conditions and in compliance with the details noted above:

- 1. No activities may take place on North Beach; all activities must be conducted at the beachfront south of the Pavilion;
- 2. No temporary shelters or tents may be erected on North Beach or adjacent to Wreck Pond;
- 3. Purchase of daily beach badges for Camp staff is waived.
- 4. The use of beach picnic areas is permitted during the operation of the camp with the purchase of beach badges as required by Borough Ordinance;
- 5. The camp's operation may be limited or further restricted in the event that any endangered species (wildlife or vegetation) are present.
 - g. R-25-2022: Authorize The Borough of Sea Girt through The Sea Girt Police Department to Participate in The Defense Logistics Agency, Law Enforcement Support Office, 1033 Program to enable The Sea Girt Police Department to Request and Acquire Excess Department of Defense Equipment from 1/1/2022 through 12/31/2022

WHEREAS, the United States Congress authorized the Defense Logistics Agency (DLA) Law Enforcement Support Office (LESO) 1033 Program to make use of excess Department of Defense personal property by making that personal property available to municipal, county and State law enforcement agencies (LEAs); and

WHEREAS, DLA rules mandate that all equipment acquired through the 1033 Program remain under the control of the requesting LEA; and

WHEREAS, participation in the 1033 Program allows municipal and county LEAs to obtain property they might not otherwise be able to afford in order to enhance community preparedness, response, and resiliency; and

WHEREAS, although property is provided through the 1033 Program at no cost to municipal and county LEAs, these entities are responsible for the costs associated with delivery, maintenance, fueling, and upkeep of the property, and for specialized training on the operation of and acquired property; and

WHEREAS, N.J.SA. 40A:5-30.2 requires that the governing body of the municipality or county approve, by a majority of the full membership, both enrollment in, and the acquisition of any property through, the 1033 Program.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Sea Girt Police Department is hereby authorized to acquire items of non-controlled property designated "DEMILA," which may include office supplies,

office furniture, computers, electronic equipment, generators, field packs, non-military vehicles, clothing, traffic signal systems, exercise equipment, moving equipment, storage devices and containers, tools, medical and first aid equipment and supplies, construction materials, lighting supplies, beds and sleeping mats, wet and cold weather equipment and supplies, respirators, binoculars and other supplies or equipment of a non-military nature identified the LEA, if it shall become available in the period of time for which this resolution authorized, based on the needs of the Sea Girt Police Department, without restriction; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT FURHTER RESOLVED, that Sea Girt Police Department is hereby authorized to acquire the following "DEMIL B through Q" property, if it shall become available in the period of time for which this resolution authorized specifically being replacements parts as needed for the up-armored Humvee presently in service; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Sea Girt Police Department shall develop and implement a full training plan and police for the maintenance and use of the acquired property; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Sea Girt Police Department shall provide a quarterly accounting of all property obtained through the 1033 Program which shall be available to the public upon request; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this resolution shall take effect immediately and shall be valid to authorize requests to acquire "DEMIL A" property and "DEMIL B through Q" property that may be made available through the 1033 Program during the period of time for which this resolution authorized; with Program participation and all property request authorization terminating on December 31st of the current calendar year from January 1, 2022.

h. R-26-2022: Authorize Proposal for Engineering Services – 2022 NJDEP Tier A Municipal Stormwater General Permit

BE IT RESOLVED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Sea Girt, County of Monmouth, State of New Jersey that the Borough of Sea Girt retains the Professional Engineering services of Leon S. Avakian, 788 Wayside Road, Neptune, New Jersey 07753, for providing for the 2022 NJDEP Tier A Municipal Stormwater General Permit. The fee is as follows:

- Review and update the Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plan (SPPP);
- Certification of the Stormwater Permit Program Annual Report and Supplemental Questionnaire;
- Update the Stormwater Infrastructure Map
- The total not to exceed Cost for Engineering Services for this Project will not exceed is \$7,000;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Sea Girt, County of Monmouth, State of New Jersey, that the Borough authorizes the above provision that each subsequent task shall require additional authorization subject to the recommendation of the Governing Body.

i. R-27-2022: Appoint Emergency Management Coordinator Timothy Harmon and Deputy Management Coordinator Justin Macko

WHEREAS, the Borough of Sea Girt is in need of the services of an Emergency Management Coordinator and Deputy Emergency Coordinator to support its operations; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that Timothy Harmon be appointed as Emergency Management Coordinator and Justin Macko as Deputy Emergency Manager for the Borough of Sea Girt, for a three year term effective on January 1, 2022 expiring December 31, 2024.

i. Ordinance No. 01-2022: The Mayor to read the Ordinance No. 01-2022 by Title:

ORDINANCE NO. 01-2022

CALENDAR YEAR 2022 ORDINANCE TO EXCEED THE MUNICIPAL BUDGET APPROPRIATION LIMITS AND TO ESTABLISH A CAP BANK (N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.14) IN THE BOROUGH OF SEA GIRT, MONMOUTH COUNTY, NEW JERSEY

WHEREAS, the Local Government Cap Law, *N.J.S.A.* 40A:4-45.1 et seq., provides that in the preparation of its annual budget, a municipality shall limit any increase in said budget up to 2.5% unless authorized by ordinance to increase it to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, subject to certain exceptions; and,

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:4:45-15a provides that a municipality may, when authorized by ordinance, appropriation the difference between the amount of its actual final appropriation and the 3.5% percentage rate as an exception to its final appropriations in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

WHEREAS, the Borough Council of the Borough of Sea Girt in the County of Monmouth finds it advisable and necessary to increase its CY2022 budget by up to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations in the interest of promoting the health, safety and welfare of the citizens; and,

WHEREAS, the Borough Council hereby determines that a 3.5% increase in the budget for said year, amounting to \$57,591.72 in excess of the increase in final appropriations otherwise permitted by the local Government Cap Law is advisable and necessary; and,

WHEREAS, the Borough Council hereby determines that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Sea Girt, in the County of Monmouth, a majority of the full authorized membership of this governing body affirmatively concurring, that in the CY2022 budget year, the final appropriations of the Borough of Sea Girt shall, in accordance with this Ordinance and *N.J.S.A.* 40A:4-45.14, be increased by 3.5%, amounting to \$201,571.01 and that the CY2022 municipal budget for Borough of Sea Girt be approved and adopted in accordance with this Ordinance.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final year budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that a certified copy of this Ordinance as introduced be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services within five (5) days of introduction.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that a certified copy of the Ordinance upon adoption, with the recorded vote included thereon, be filed with said Director within five (5) days after such adopted.

UPON MOTION of Councilman Clemmensen, seconded by Councilman Perry, carried, that the meeting be opened to the public for comments on the said Ordinance only. There were no comments from the public participating and **UPON MOTION** of Councilman Clemmensen, seconded by Councilman Perry, carried, the public hearing was closed.

k. R-30-2022: Urging the USPS to Upgrade Security of Public Collection Mailboxes

UPON MOTION of Councilman Clemmensen, seconded by Councilwoman Richman, carried, that the following Resolution be and the same is hereby adopted.

WHEREAS, the Borough of Sea Girt seeks the assistance of Congressman Chris Smith in petitioning the United State Postal Service to install secure mailboxes throughout the Borough; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Sea Girt's residents have experienced an increase in mail theft crime, resulting in a loss in excess of \$270,000 to various residents of the Borough; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council recognize that the Borough of Sea Girt is just one of many communities experiencing USPS mailbox crime and implores the Unites States Postal Service to bolster security of their mailboxes that serve the Borough of Sea Girt; and

WHEREAS, it is recognized that the lack of secure postal mailboxes leads to drawn out investigations and use of police resources that could be apportioned throughout the Borough; and

WHEREAS, residents of the Borough should feel that their mail is safe and secure when utilizing USPS mailboxes and that all measures are taken by the USPS to ensure that public mailboxes are tamper-proof; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Sea Girt, in the County of Monmouth urges the United States Postal Service, in conjunction with Congressman Chris Smith to install upgraded mailboxes at the following locations:

7. COUNCIL REPORTS

Councilman Clemmensen reported Altice will be running fiber optic cable throughout the Borough through Friday; workers will be in rear yards to reach utility poles. The Police Department have been in touch with JCP&L regarding street light outage issues; JCP&L hopes to have the issue resolved soon; residents my report outages by calling 1-888-544-4877 or email jmacko@seagirtpd.net. The Police and OEM are closely monitoring the upcoming storm; please remove vehicles from the street to allow snow plowing operations; please follow Sea Girts social media platforms and RAVE Alerts for updates.

Councilwoman Richman reported she met with the Shore Community Alliance to set their schedule for the upcoming year; there will be a vaping program for 6th-8th graders and virtual follow up with parents; there will be a Mental Health Awareness Program and a Wall and Manasquan Community Event in May; letters went to surrounding sending districts with information on available funding.

Councilman Perry reported the Finance Committee will meet soon to plan for the 2022 budget. He also commented the Polar Plunge is February 5^{th} to benefit the LIFT Fund; registration is still open on our website for plungers and donations.

Councilman Zakin reported he met with Librarian Lisa Luke and staff and saw all the great work they do at the Library; it is the 30th Anniversary of the Library being at the train station, prior it was at The Lighthouse and originally started in a closet the Borough Hall; a logo contest is in place for children ages 9-14; deadline for submission is February 25th.

Council President Anthony reported the Bike Path is progressing nicely. The Sea Girt Recreation Tree Donation Program has begun its coordination status; \$10,000.00 has been raised thus far towards planting new trees in our community; she thanked everyone for their efforts.

Mayor Fetzer reported he met with Library Trustees for their re-organization meeting; they are working on their budget with the Borough to meet a mandatory amount that needs to be raised by taxes. Plans are to meet a second time with the PBA Bargaining Unit soon. The Fire Company received its new truck; training is in progress to operate the truck; he thanked the Truck Committee for the numerous hours spent on ordering the truck and to the Borough for their support with payment. Engineer, Peter Avakian is hoping to have Platform Tennis Plans for Crescent Park ready by February 9th or March 9th meeting; information will be updated on our website. We will seek comments from various committees as well as comments from the residents; Mayor Fetzer recommends that council gives a courtesy submission of the plan to the Planning Board for their comments.

Councilman Zakin clarified that there will not be a vote on the Platform Tennis Courts; there will be time to review and comment from the public prior to any vote taking place.

There was a change to the agenda at this time to allow for Administrator Report to be heard, which was omitted from the agenda.

Administrator Jim Gant read a statement on EMS Services (statement is attached to these minutes); he then introduced resident, Mr. Ferguson who gave a presentation on the Monument Memorial Recognition; applications can be found on our website and at The Borough Hall; deadline to submit applications is February 28th.
