MINUTES - REGULAR MEETING July 11, 2018

The Regular Meeting of the Borough of Sea Girt Council was called to order by Mayor F. Ken Farrell at 7:00 PM on Wednesday, July 11, 2018 at the Sea Girt Elementary School, Bell Place, Sea Girt. Mayor Farrell asked for a moment of silence; he then led those in attendance in the Pledge of Allegiance.

The Clerk read the Compliance Statement: This meeting is called pursuant to the provisions of the Open Public Meetings Act, C.231, P.L.1975: adequate notice of this meeting has been given by posting a notice on the Borough's official bulletin board and by transmitting a copy of the Notice to the Borough's two official newspapers, *The Asbury Park Press* and *The Coast Star* as required by law

Council President Fetzer arrived at 7:05 pm.

2. PRESENTATION:

Mayor Farrell introduced Councilwoman Morris and Librarian Lisa Luke, who presented information on leaving the Monmouth County Library System including the proposed expansion of the Library facility and the possible development of a town center in the Plaza (copy of the presentation is attached to these Minutes). Councilwoman Morris emphasized that the two projects are individual proposals not dependent upon each other.

After the presentation, Mayor Farrell opened the meeting to the public for comments.

Mrs. Cavanaugh, Beacon Blvd., stated that she is opposed to leaving MCL unless the Borough can guarantee the same services; she encourages everyone to get a MCL card to try their services.

Judy Tolchin, MCL Director, noted that the County Library offers a larger investment in the community than is represented by the estimated value of the services received.

Heidi Amici, Assistant Director of MCL, offered some statistical data and reiterated that there is a great variety of services offered through the County Library.

LeAnn Hoffman, Philadelphia Blvd., questioned the cost estimates to run a proposed community Library, adding that in her estimation, it would cost more to operate than the figures presented this evening; she stated that she needs more information before she can vote on a referendum.

Councilman Mulroy noted that as the value of homes increase, the Borough will be paying significantly more to the County for the same services.

John Shibles, Ocean Ave., noted that the tax to the county is and will be increasing based on ratables; the Borough is hurt us due to small population and large ratable base.

Eva Fatenko, Boston Blvd., thanked Council for keeping town green.

At the conclusion of the comments, Mayor Farrell thanked everyone for their comments and noted that the Borough commented that currently, the Borough sends 41% of the our levy to Monmouth County and spends only 31% on ourselves for great services; in 2017, the county doubled the open space tax and noted that it could happen to library tax. He further stated that on a per capita basis, the Wall Twp. cost per resident is \$37 vs \$242 for Sea Girt; leaving MCL is a difficult decision, but the plan is to provide the same services while keeping control of tax dollars.

WHEREAS, the Local Finance Board has promulgated *N.J.A.C.* 5:30-6.5, a regulation requiring that the governing body of each municipality shall by resolution certify to the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey that all members of the governing body have reviewed, as a minimum, the sections of the annual audit entitled "General Comments" and "Recommendations"; and.

WHEREAS, the members of the governing body have personally reviewed as a minimum the Annual Report of Audit, and specifically the sections of the Annual Audit entitled "General Comments" and "Recommendations" as evidenced by the group affidavit form of the governing body attached hereto; and,

WHEREAS, such resolution of certification shall be adopted by the Governing Body no later than forty-five days after the receipt of the annual audit, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 5:30-6.5; and,

WHEREAS, all members of the governing body have received and have familiarized themselves with, at least, the minimum requirements of the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey, as stated aforesaid and have subscribed to the affidavit, as provided by the Local Finance Board; and

WHEREAS, failure to comply with the regulations of the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey may subject the members of the local governing body to the penalty provisions of *R.S.* 52:27BB-52, to wit:

R.S. 52:27BB-52: A local officer or member of a local governing body who, after a date fixed for compliance, fails or refuses to obey an order of the director (Director of Local Government Services), under the provisions of this Article, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction, may be fined not more than one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) or imprisoned for not more than one year, or both, in addition shall forfeit his office.

WHEREAS, it is required that the Borough of Sea Girt execute a project agreement with Monmouth County to undertake a project known as ADA Improvements and WHEREAS, the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development is requiring that the Mayor of the Borough of Sea Girt sign additional certifications in order to receive these funds; and,

WHEREAS, the Borough of Sea Girt had adopted a policy prohibiting the use of excessive force by its law enforcement agency (police force) within its jurisdiction against any individuals engaged in non-violent civil rights demonstrations; and,

WHEREAS, a copy of that policy is attached to and made part of this resolution.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Borough of Sea Girt has met conditions of receiving a FY 2018 allocation by adopting a policy prohibiting the use of excessive force and by not using federal funds for lobbying or by disclosing that funds have been used for lobbying.







Future of Sea Girt Library Frequently Asked Questions

Why is the town recommending Sea Girt leave the Monmouth County Library System (MCL)? The amount of tax each town pays to have a public library is set by state mandate based on a town's ratables. Last year Sea Girt paid a County Library Tax of \$411,234. This tax pays for services such as computers and software, purchasing of items for the library, services of a children's librarian. (Estimated value of services received from MCL: \$100,000/year.)

The MCL tax does not cover staff salaries, office supplies, periodical subscriptions, building maintenance or utilities. The MCL tax, which increases every year, is more than we can possibly receive in benefits.

How does this affect our taxes?

Currently, the average tax per household paid to the Monmouth County Library system is \$330, which is the 2nd highest in the county.

If the Borough elects not to be part of the County library system, we will no longer be paying a county library tax (average \$330) but instead a Borough library tax will be instituted and the estimated amount of this levy (also set by state statute) will increase to an average of \$610 per household; for a net increase (\$610 - \$330) of \$280 dollars annually. The benefit is that whatever money is not used to operate the library will accrue to the general borough fund to offset local taxes. This is how other independently operating libraries, such as Avon and Spring Lake, function. The estimated cost of running an independent library is \$250,000 annually, less than the current library tax to MCL.

What will an independent library look like?

The same! With the exception of long-term loan items and office equipment, everything in the library is currently owned by Sea Girt Library.

How will I borrow materials that aren't currently in the library?

There are many sources for independent libraries to borrow from. The source most accessed by other independent libraries is the NJ State Inter Library Loan (ILL) system. We will receive deliveries from ILL as often as we have from MCL.

What about electronic downloads?

Sea Girt Library will join electronic services such as Overdrive and Hoopla for electronic downloads and streaming services.

How will the library be run?

A governing Board of Trustees will be formed which will include the SGES Superintendent, the Mayor (or his designee,) and the members of the current Friends of the Sea Girt Library board. Lisa Luke and JoAnn Johnson will remain as librarians.

Will there still be a children's librarian?

Absolutely! We will hire a children's librarian for a full day on Thursdays.
