### **ORDINANCE NO. 09-2016**

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND AND SUPPLEMENT CHAPTER VII, TRAFFIC, ARTICLE 7-15.1, PARKING PROHIBITED DURING CERTAIN HOURS ON CERTAIN STREETS FROM MAY 15 TO SEPTEMBER 15; ARTICLE 7-18, ANGLE PARKING; ARTICLE 7-25, VEHICLES OVER DESIGNATED WEIGHT EXCLUDED FROM CERTAIN STREETS; ARTICLE 7-33, SPEED LIMITS AND ARTICLE 7-40.4, REGULATION FOR THE MOVEMENT AND PARKING OF TRAFFIC ON MUNICIPAL PARK PROPERTY OF THE BOROUGH CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF SEA GIRT

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the Borough of Sea Girt as follows:

**Section 1.** Article 7-15.1 PARKING PROHIBITED DURING CERTAIN HOURS ON CERTAIN STREETS FROM MAY 15 TO SEPTEMBER 15 is hereby revised as follows:

No person shall park a vehicle during the period commencing on May 15 and terminating on September 15 upon any of the following streets or parts of streets. (Ord. No. 567 § III; Ord. No. 739 § I [III g]; New; Ord. No. 20-2013)

Section 2. Article 7-18 ANGLE PARKING is hereby revised by deleting The Terrace, south side of the street, from the schedule of street or parts of streets established as Angle Parking.

**Section 3.** Article 7-25 VEHICLES OVER DESIGNATED WEIGHT EXCLUDED FROM CERTAIN STREETS, is hereby revised and supplemented as follows:

Vehicles over the registered gross weight are hereby excluded from the streets or parts of streets described except for the pick-up and delivery of materials on such street, or the use of emergency vehicles on such street.

Section 6. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed, but only to the extent of such inconsistency.

Section 7. This Ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days after adoption and final publication as required by law.

Mayor Farrell noted at this time the public hearing be carried to next meeting.

#### 9. NEW BUSINESS

## A. 2015 Audit Report – The Administrator reported as follows:

- 1. Audit finds that the Borough's financial condition is excellent;
- 2. Audit contains no comments or recommendations for improvement;
- 3. Note: As described in Note 1 to the financial statements, the Borough changed accounting policies related to the reporting of pensions by state and governments by adopting the Statement of Government Account Standards (GASB Statement) No. 68, Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pension an Amendment of GASB Statement No. 27, during the year ended December 31, 2015. According to the regulatory basis of accounting, the cumulative effect of the accounting change as of the beginning of the year is not reported in the Comparative Statement of Operations and Changes in Fund Balance Regulatory Basis. Total obligation per fund: PERS, estimated \$5.1M; PFRS, estimated \$5.9M.

Mayor Farrell explained various section of the audit report, and reiterated that the Borough is in excellent financial shape. He did comment that while the pension information appears as a note on the municipal audit now, there could be a time when the State would change the funding mechanism for the pensions that could result in a greater liability for the Borough, and he noted that we will be carefully tracking any developments. Council President Fetzer commented that the audit having no comments or recommendations is commendable. Councilperson Foley added

Mrs. Carafa does a great job, but the future of the pension system could require changes in the Borough's budget.

4. **Resolution No. 138-2016:** Governing Body Certification/Acceptance of Audit Report – governing body must certify that they are familiar with, at a minimum, the sections entitled "General Comments" and "Recommendations"

**UPON MOTION** of Councilperson Buonocore, seconded by Councilperson Mulroy, carried, that the following Resolution be and the same is hereby adopted:

**WHEREAS,** N.J.S.A. 40A:5-4 requires the governing body of every local unit to have made an annual audit of its books, accounts and financial transactions; and

**WHEREAS**, the Annual Report of Audit for the year 2015 has been filed by a Registered Municipal Accountant with the Municipal Clerk pursuant to *N.J.S.A.* 40A:5-6, and a copy has been received by each member of the governing body; and,

WHEREAS, R.S. 52:27BB-34 authorizes the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey to prescribe reports pertaining to the local fiscal affairs; and,

WHEREAS, the Local Finance Board has promulgated *N.J.A.C.* 5:30-6.5, a regulation requiring that the governing body of each municipality shall by resolution certify to the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey that all members of the governing body have reviewed, as a minimum, the sections of the annual audit entitled "General Comments" and "Recommendations"; and,

WHEREAS, the members of the governing body have personally reviewed as a minimum the Annual Report of Audit, and specifically the sections of the Annual Audit entitled "General Comments" and "Recommendations" as evidenced by the group affidavit form of the governing body attached hereto; and.

WHEREAS, such resolution of certification shall be adopted by the Governing Body no later than forty-five days after the receipt of the annual audit, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 5:30-6.5; and,

WHEREAS, all members of the governing body have received and have familiarized themselves with, at least, the minimum requirements of the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey, as stated aforesaid and have subscribed to the affidavit, as provided by the Local Finance Board; and

**WHEREAS**, failure to comply with the regulations of the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey may subject the members of the local governing body to the penalty provisions of *R.S.* 52:27BB-52, to wit:

R.S. 52:27BB-52: A local officer or member of a local governing body who, after a date fixed for compliance, fails or refuses to obey an order of the director (Director of Local Government Services), under the provisions of this Article, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction, may be fined not more than one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) or imprisoned for not more than one year, or both, in addition shall forfeit his office.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Borough Council of the Borough of Sea Girt hereby states that it has complied with the promulgation of the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey dated July 30, 1968 and does hereby submit a certified copy of this resolution and the required affidavit to said Board to show evidence of said compliance.

WHEREAS, this contract modification includes final adjustments to contract item quantities based on as-built conditions for the including the shortening of the overall length of the Neptune Outfall extension resulting from the discovery of significant quantities of jetty stone in the project area and the costs associated with restocking and removal of materials that were previously supplied and delivered to the site; and,

WHEREAS, the Borough Engineer has reviewed the said Contract Modification Proposal No. 5 and recommends the approval of the same.

WHEREAS, in this era of fiscal constraint, participation in the 1033 program allows local units to obtain equipment that they might not otherwise be able to afford, and to prepare for, respond to, and recover from incidents of terrorism and natural disasters, such as hurricanes and severe floods; and,

WHEREAS, although equipment is provided through the 1033 program at no cost to county and municipal law enforcement agencies, these entities are responsible for costs associated with the maintenance, fueling, and upkeep of this equipment and for specialized training for its operation; and,

WHEREAS, taxpayers are the primary consumers and financiers of services provided by county and municipal law enforcement agencies and have the right to be assured that their money is being spent in an efficient and effective manner, and the right to know the purposes for which public funds are utilized; and,

WHEREAS, it is therefore appropriate to establish a system of local oversight for county and municipal law enforcement agencies that participate in and acquire equipment through the 1033 program and guidelines for the use of this equipment by those entities; and,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Mayor and Borough Council of the Borough of Sea Girt that it hereby authorizes the Department of Public Works, the Chief of Police or his designee, and the Borough Administrator to participate in the federal 1033 program.

- A. The Crescent Park Rehabilitation Project Council Sub-Committees, Public Buildings, Grounds and Landscaping and Public Works, have met to discuss the matter; P. Vasan has donated the "Crescent Park Stewardship Plan" to the Borough for submission to the DEP, Community Forestry Office. There will be further discussion in the future.
- B. Neptune, Seaside, Morven Infrastructure Improvement Project: Contractor has installed main on Seaside from First to Sea Girt Avenues; east of First should be completed

- by Monday, July 11; remaining work includes lateral tie-ins and hydrant replacements; work on Neptune will commence at the conclusion of the work on Seaside;
- C. TTF grants: Baltimore Blvd. and Neptune/Seaside/Morven Terrace fall under the project suspension ordered by the Governor. Baltimore Blvd. Project is complete with only final reimbursement pending. I have requested clarification from the DOT as to any options the Borough may have to be able to proceed with our fall paving of Neptune, Seaside and Morven Terrace, including permission to move forward at the Borough's expense and request reimbursement of eligible costs when the TTF is re-authorized.
- D. **Baltimore Outfall Extension** Peter Avakian is working on a report to Council regarding the feasibility of, the process to and the estimated cost of altering the ACoE design protocol;
- E. Carriage Way/The Terrace our Engineers are working on plans to be presented publicly sometime in September;
- F. **Sight Triangles/Encroaching Branches** DPW staff have inspected the entire town and found a few problems that have been or will be addressed, either by notification to the property owner or by DPW staff.

## 14. PUBLIC PARTICIPATION ON ANY SUBJECT (Comments limited to 7 minutes)

Mike D'Altrui, Lori Loughlin and Jen Perry, members of the Recreation Commission, thanked Patty Peterson for putting together a great series of summer programs. They presented a plan to Council to improve and maintain Baltimore Park in the Borough; noting that they prepared an application for the Monmouth County Open Space Grant Program. The request is for \$200,000, with \$100,000 as the grant request and \$100,000 in matching funds from the Recreation Trust. Mr. D'Altrui thanked Bill Kurtz for donating his time to prepare the conceptual plan that includes five (5) specific areas of improvement: create more shade by expanding the overhang in front of the building; add shrubs along Baltimore Blvd. for safety as well as aesthetics; t-ball field improvements including improvements to the area where soccer is played and add bleachers to the area. The Committee welcomes feedback on the proposed improvements. Mayor Farrell is happy to work with the committee and the Freeholders. Councilperson Mulroy asked if bathrooms are handicapped accessible; he was advised that they are. Councilperson Morris asked if the plan will address the existing tree roots lifting the pavers; there was no clear response to this question. Mr. D'Altrui asked for commitment from the Borough to maintain the improvements once the project is completed at the park. Councilperson Foley asked if a sprinkler system is in place and although there is one in place, the plan is to possibly upgrade the existing system.

Tess Manley, Ocean Avenue, read a statement noting that there is a clear lack of respect from the Parker House patrons; they continue to disrupt the quality of life of residents who live in the area near the establishment.

Candace Kadimik, Beacon Blvd., shared an unpleasant experience in Sea Girt Court and suggested that more stringent enforcement is necessary.

Mr. McNulty, Ocean Avenue., asked who controls the liquor license and response was the Borough, overseen by the ABC.

Edward Farb, Ocean Avenue, questioned the progress of the outfall extension study committee; Councilperson Rotolo noted as important as the committee is, he does not have time to chair a committee although he would help where he can; Mr. Farb is thinking of hiring their own Coastal Engineer for fresh input; Councilperson Rotolo asked if the report from our Engineer was complete; Mrs. Carafa replied Mr. Avakian's office can prepare a full estimate of the costs for the preparation of the applications, permits, design and plans for an alteration to the outfall that could pass DEP and ACoE muster; she will ask him to prepare this report.

There being no further business, and **UPON MOTION** of Councilperson Rotolo, seconded by Councilperson Buonocore, carried, that the meeting be finally and immediately adjourned at 9:45 pm.
