6. OLD BUSINESS

A. Ordinance No. 01-2016: public hearing/adoption

The Mayor read the said Ordinance by Title and advised of its publication in its entirety in *The Coast Star* on January 14, 2016:

ORDINANCE NO. 01-2016

CALENDAR YEAR 2016 ORDINANCE TO EXCEED THE MUNICIPAL BUDGETAPPROPRIATION LIMITS AND TO ESTABLISH A CAP BANK (N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.14) IN THE BOROUGH OF SEA GIRT, MONMOUTH COUNTY, NEW JERSEY

WHEREAS, the Local Government Cap Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.1 et seq., provides that in the preparation of its annual budget, a municipality shall limit any increase in said budget up to 0% unless authorized by ordinance to increase it to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, subject to certain exceptions; and,

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:4:45-15a provides that a municipality may, when authorized by ordinance, appropriation the difference between the amount of its actual final appropriation and the 3.5% percentage rate as an exception to its final appropriations in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

WHEREAS, the Borough Council of the Borough of Sea Girt in the County of Monmouth finds it advisable and necessary to increase its CY 2016 budget by up to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations in the interest of promoting the health, safety and welfare of the citizens; and,

WHEREAS, the Borough Council hereby determines that a 3.5% increase in the budget for said year, amounting to \$173,942.08 in excess of the increase in final appropriations otherwise permitted by the local Government Cap Law is advisable and necessary; and,

WHEREAS, the Borough Council hereby determines that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Sea Girt, in the County of Monmouth, a majority of the full authorized membership of this governing body affirmatively concurring, that in the CY 2016 budget year, the final appropriations of the Borough of Sea Girt shall, in accordance with this Ordinance and N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.14, be increased by 3.5%, amounting to \$173,942.08 and that the CY 2016 municipal budget for Borough of Sea Girt be approved and adopted in accordance with this Ordinance.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final year budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that a certified copy of this Ordinance as introduced be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services within five (5) days of introduction.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that a certified copy of the Ordinance upon adoption, with the recorded vote included thereon, be filed with said Director within five (5) days after such adopted.

UPON MOTION of Councilperson Morris, seconded by Council President Fetzer, carried, that the meeting be opened to the public for comments on the said Ordinance only. There were no comments from the public present, and **UPON MOTION** of Council President Fetzer, seconded by Councilperson Mulroy, carried, the public hearing was closed.

Avakian, Inc., submitted a proposal in December 2015 indicating they will provide said services and have provided a Business Entity Disclosure Certification which certifies that members of the firm have not made any reportable contribution to a political or candidate committee in the Borough of Sea Girt in the previous one year, and that the contract will prohibit each entity from making any reportable contribution throughout the term of the contract; and

WHEREAS, with regards to Affirmative Action, incorporated into such agreement shall be the mandatory language of Section 5.3 of the regulations promulgated by the Treasurer of the State of New Jersey pursuant to P.L. 1975, and

WHEREAS, funds are available for this purpose in the 2016 temporary budget and provision will be made in the 2016 and succeeding years' budgets of the Borough as finally adopted, and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Sea Girt hereby authorizes the Mayor and Municipal Clerk to enter into a contract with the professional as described herein.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Business Disclosure Entity Certification and the Determination of Value be placed on file with this resolution and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a copy of this resolution shall be published in The Coast Star as required by law within ten (10) days of its passage.

B. **Resolution No. 25 - 2016:** Approve Change Order and Supplemental Agreement No. 1 Utility Improvements to Baltimore Blvd., Lucas Construction Group, Inc.

WHEREAS, the Borough Council authorized and awarded a contract to Lucas Construction Group, Inc., Morganville, NJ, for the Project known as Utility Improvements to Baltimore Boulevard, in the amount of \$529,400.00 on February 25, 2015; and,

WHEREAS, the project is completed and final as-built quantities calculated, resulting in the need for Final Change Order and Supplemental Agreement No. 1, including a decrease in contract quantities/price of \$70,620.00 and an increase in contract quantities/price of \$27,027.50 for a net decrease of \$43,592.50 to a new contract total of \$485,807.50; and,

WHEREAS, the contractor has submitted the required maintenance bond in the amount of \$121,451.88 pursuant to the Bid Specifications and Contract Documents and his request for final payment has been reviewed and approved by the Borough Engineer in the amount of \$24,416.15.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Sea Girt that Final Change Order and Supplemental Agreement No. 1 as referenced above totaling a net decrease of \$43,592.50 as an amendment to the contract between Lucas Construction Group, Inc., Morganville, NJ and the Borough of Sea Girt for the Project known as Utility Improvements to Baltimore Boulevard be and the same is hereby approved.

E. Resolution No. 28-2016 - Resolution Authorizing Monmouth County Mosquito Control Division to Conduct Aerial Surveillance and Treatment Program, April 1, 2016 Through November 30, 2016, Inclusive

UPON MOTION of Councilperson Buonocore, seconded by Councilperson Mulroy, carried, that the following Resolution be and the same is hereby adopted:

WHEREAS, the Monmouth County Board of Chosen Freeholders, pursuant to *N.J.S.A.* 26:9-27, *et seq.*, has elected through its Mosquito Control Division to perform all acts necessary for the elimination of mosquito breeding areas and/or to exterminate mosquitoes within the County; and,

WHEREAS, the County has institutes an Integrated Pest Management Program consisting of surveillance, water management, biological control and chemical control to exterminate the mosquito population with the County of Monmouth; and,

WHEREAS, prior to conducting aerial dispensing operations over a designated "congested area", the County is required, pursuant to Federal Aviation Administration Regulation (FAR Part 137.51), to secure prior written approval from the governing body of the political subdivision under which the aircraft is to be operated; and,

WHEREAS, the Borough of Sea Girt is designated as a "congested area" by the Federal Aviation Administration and the County has requested that this governing body consent to its proposed aerial dispensing operations.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Borough Council of the Borough of Sea Girt hereby authorizes the Monmouth County Mosquito Control Division or its agents to apply pesticides by aircraft for mosquito control in certain areas of the Borough of Sea Girt designated by the County as being either larval mosquito habitat or areas harboring high populations of mosquitoes constituting either a nuisance, a health hazard or both with the understanding that: after notifying the Borough of Sea Girt Police Department prior to each and every application minimum of seven (7) days prior to the commencement of such operations:

- The County shall utilize pesticides, application equipment and aircraft that are approved for aerial application by the applicable Federal (USEPA) and State (NJDEP) agencies.
- Such operations will be performed in compliance with applicable Federal and State regulations.
- c. The County will notify the Police Department of each municipality over which aerial pesticide operations are planned at least seven (7) days prior to commencement of such operations.

F. Conditionally Approving or Denying Use of Rough Property by Patrick Finan for a For-Profit Private Enterprise.

Upon request of Council, Patrick Finan of Sea Bright presented information and explained his concept. Councilmembers commented on the concept as noted:

- Mayor Farrell noted he was concerned vehicle use/parking used in this endeavor;
- Councilperson Foley commented he does not like the idea and that it could result
 in issues between patrons; he suggested that the process should remain as is, firstcome, first-served to obtain space on the beach;
- Council President Fetzer and Councilperson Mulroy are not in favor of this here in Sea Girt;
- Councilperson Rotolo suggested that the person arranging for the service must arrive at the same time as delivery;
- Councilperson Buonocore asked if Mr. Finan had surveyed beachgoers to determine if there would be sufficient demand for the service; Mr. Finan advised that he had not;
- Councilperson Morris would like to see a more comprehensive plan before considering the request;
- Attorney Nick Montenegro noted that a condition of the approval could require
 the delivery person to remain with the items on-site until the person arranging for
 the service arrives at the beach.

Mayor Farrell suggested and by consensus, Council agreed, that the Resolution be tabled until additional information is provided.

G. **Resolution No. 29-2016:** Memorialize appoint of temporary office assistant, Dana Harriman @ \$10/hour for hours worked.

8. ADMINISTRATOR REPORTS/DISCUSSION

- A. Pool Application Report, 2010-15, inclusive, provided by Planning Board Chairman Norman Hall in response to questions raised at the December 2015 Council meeting: Here is a report on pool applications that required a variance from 2010-2015: There were a total of 13 over five years; all except one was on a corner lot. None allowed increase of lot coverage; 12 involved fence height or location; some had relief of distance to a structure. This information was also included in the 2015 Annual Report of Planning Board activity.
- B. Impervious Coverage Limitation The Administrator advised that the Ordinance has been drafted but requires additional review by the Borough Engineer and Attorney before introduction; she advised that she anticipated the Ordinance would be ready for introduction during February.
- 9. QPA REPORTS (of activity since previous Council Meeting): None

10. COUNCIL REPORTS

Councilperson Foley and Council President Fetzer had no reports.

Councilperson Buonocore reported that the Personnel Committee met and identified a candidate for the Library position. He referred to Councilperson Morris for additional comments.

Councilperson Morris reported as follows:

- She was pleased to announce that Lisa Luke, a current volunteer, has been chosen to fill
 the Librarian position; she will be starting next week and noted that Ms. Luke's
 background and marketing experience will benefit the Library.
- Public Safety Committee Lt. Kremp will retire as of March 1, 2016 after 30 years of service to the Borough; she noted that he was a valuable team member who was the Chief's second in command, and extremely instrumental in recruiting and hiring of new personnel. The Police Department will be busy the next couple of weeks as we begin interviewing for Patrolman, Sergeant and Captain; she also noted that Chief Davenport obtained a grant for body worn cameras for 2016. He requested 15 and received approval for 11 cameras at \$500 each; she further noted although there are additional costs for the necessary software and hardware to fully operate the cameras, we are very pleased to have been chosen for this award.

Councilperson Rotolo reported as follows:

The Recreation Committee met and discussed programs for the summer, including soccer
and tennis; there will be two movies shown this summer at the beach and an RFP for the
resurfacing of the Crescent Park tennis courts will be issued. A new Paddle Court
reservation system will be implemented and should be fully operational shortly and if
successful, could be expanded to include the tennis courts.

Councilperson Mulroy reported as follows:

- Beach Committee met and reviewed the budget and capital needs as well as personnel requirements;
- On-line beach badge registration system in being updated for 2016 and should be operational by the target date of March 1;
- Researching the cost to purchase "Mobi Mat" brand walkway for the beach;
- Kayak storage has been underutilized during the last several seasons and the Committee agreed to repurpose ten (10) of the kayak lockers for general storage as a test this season; if this is successful, additional lockers will be converted;
- Thanked the Fire Department for their on-going support during the recent storm.

Mayor Farrell reported as follows:

- SMRSA work began on replacement of Belmar pump station; 3 others have been replaced. Infrastructure work is continuing including on the outfall, funded by a grant from FEMA;
- 50M in infrastructure projects since 2000:
- Connection fee has been increased to \$1,820 for 2016 for new connection;
- Budget is up 1.8%; Sea Girt up slightly more than 4% to \$272,000 for 2016;
- Although overall debt service has been reduced, the Authority will not reduce the amount allocated annually but will "reserve" these fund to create a pay-as-you-go capital fund for future projects;
- Parker House met with management on January 11th; management is very committed to working with the Borough to address the issues that occurred last summer. He noted that he conveyed to them that we will not tolerate bad behavior by their patrons.
- Thanked all volunteers and staff for their efforts during the storm and noted that John Meehan from JCP&L was very helpful; we had many issues with trees and they will be coming to us with a plan for trimming trees.
- Read a letter from Colleen Pryor, President of the Board of Education, who thanked our DPW and Police Department for all their work and help during the storm.
